A Brief History of the College

A College at Rajapuram had been a long cherished dream of thousands of pioneers of colonization since 1979. With the blessings of His Excellency Rt. Rev. Dr. Kuriakose Kunnassery, Bishop of Kottayam and under the leadership of Rev. Fr. Cyriac Thazhathottam, Rev. Fr. Stephen Niravath, Rev. Fr. Jacob Valel and the co-operation of the local people enough land was procured for a college. The Calicut University inspection commission recommended the college at Rajapuram in 1983. In 1994 Sri. Oommen Chandy the Finance Minister presented a budget proposal for a college at Rajapuram. It was in 1995 under the patronage of His Excellency Rt. Rev. Dr. Kuriakose Kunnacherry and the able guidance of Msgr. Stephen Jairaj, the Vicar General of Malabar Region of Kottayam Diocese and the local Manager Rev. Fr. Mathew Kuzhippallil St. Pius X College was started with University affiliation, offering B.Sc Microbiology (with Chemistry and Physiology as sub), B.Sc Physics (with Mathematics and Computer Science sub), and (B.A. Economics with Mathematical Economics and Mathematics for Economic Analysis sub). In 1999 B.B.S. course was started

as a self financing in the year and was converted to aided B.B.A Programme in the year 2009. , B.A Economics was changed to B.A Development Economics with computer applications as one of the main papers. We are fortunate enough to get B.Sc computer Science in the unaided stream in the year 2000, which was brought to aided category by the government in 2010. During the academic year 2005-06 M.A (Development Economics) has been sanctioned as a self financing course by the University. In the academic year 2013-14 Govt. sanctioned M.A Development Economics and B.Com courses as aided courses.

St. Pius X College is the first institution in the Kannur University to receive accreditation from the National Assessment and Accreditation Council in 2005 with B+. In 2014 NAAC Re-accredited the institution with A grade (3.11) which was the highest grade point in the Kannur university under new criteria

Kerala Ragging Prohibition Act – 1998

For the information of the students and their parents, ragging prohibition act published in 1998, forbidding ragging in the Educational Institutions of Kerala is quoted below.

2(B) By Ragging:- It is meant any physical or mental torture or any disorderly conduct towards any student of an educational institution causing apprehension, dread, humiliation or agitation in him/her. It can be any harassment like insulting teasing, bullying or manhandling. It can also be forcing upon him/her to do something, which he/she voluntarily won't dare to do normally.

Prohibition or ragging:- Ragging is prohibited both inside and outside in an educational institution.

The punishment for ragging:- Any student involved in ragging/persuades others for ragging or advocates ragging/either inside or outside and educational institution shall be subject to a punishment or not more than two years imprisonment in addition to a penalty not over Rs. 10,000/-

Dismissal of a student:- A student subject to the punishment under section IV is liable to be dismissed from the institution and is barred from being admitted to any other institution for a period of three years from the date of receipt of his/her dismissal order.

Suspension of a Student:- If a student/parent/guardian or any teacher of the institution forwards a written complaint to the head of the institution, he has to make an urgent enquiry into the matter within 7 days of receipt of such a complaint. If the allegation is proved to be correct, the accused must be suspended with immediate effect and the matter must be referred to the police for further proceedings. He has to make a detailed enquiry and if it is found baseless the complainant must be informed of it in writing.

Abetting:- If the head of the institution refuses to take action in the manner described under section 6 or is negligent in initiating any steps, he is to be treated as one abetting the crime and is liable to

be punished under section 42(1) as is said in Sub-section I, if a writ complaint is received by the head of the institution, he has to make a detailed enquiry and if it is found baseless the complainant must be informed of it in writing.

In addition to the existing Rules and Regulations, the following set of Rules are incorporated in the Rules & Regulations of the College w.e.f. 01-06-2015

1. Academic excellence and Discipline are the 1. main concern of the institution.
2. All political and organisational activities are strictly prohibited in the campus. Student organisations are not recognised by the college authorities and are banned inside campus. Their requests or demands shall not be entertained. However, those organisations that are complementary to the academic pursuit can be permitted by the Principal.
3. Nobody shall disrupt the academic atmosphere of the college under any circumstances. Any such activities that may hamper the academic ambience of the institution will be seriously dealt with. Such misconduct would entail major punishment including expulsion from college. If necessary, criminal prosecution also will be invoked.
4. Destruction of college properties would entail civil as well as criminal proceedings against delinquents and they will be held liable to pay compensation for the loss.
5. Nobody shall instigate or engage in activities such as strike, demonstration, agitation, slogan shouting etc. within college campus. Wearing tag or any activity propagating student politics also have been strictly prohibited.
6. College union election will be conducted only under indirect mode / parliamentary system. No external or political interference shall be permitted. Outsiders shall not enter college campus without the permission of college authorities.

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7. Smoking/chewing, use of tobacco, pan parag, drugs, 7. liquor etc., are strictly prohibited inside the college campus including all such products that are either banned, illicit or injurious to health. Nobody shall enter the college campus after consuming liquor/drugs or under intoxication.
 8. Use of Cell Phone / Mobile Phone is prohibited inside College Campus. Cell phone /mobile phone shall be switched off before entering the campus. Cell Phones with camera are banned insided college campus by the State Government. In the event of any violation of the above, action will be taken including confiscation of the device and imposition of fine.
 9. All legal and reasonable grievance of the students will be addressed by the college authorities. In the event of any such grievance, the aggrieved can approach the respective Class Teacher or the Student's Grievance Reddressal Committee existing in the College. The decision of the Principal shall be final.
 10. Teachers are directed to insist the compliance of the above Rules and Regulations strictly, Violations, if any, shall be reported to the Principal swiftly.

GUIDELINES & RULES

Institutional Policies on Discipline

Objectives

1. To inculcate an attitude of responsible freedom among the students
2. To empower students to take responsibility of their actions
3. To improve the academic environment of the campus
4. To give a message that indiscipline shall not be tolerated in the institution

1. Preamble

- 1.1 The motto of the discipline committee shall be - “Responsible freedom for academic excellence”.
- 1.2 Any student having a complaint has all the liberty to express it to the tutor in charge, Head of the Department, teacher in charge, members of the Grievance Committee, Principal and Manager.
- 1.3 Normally, it is suggested that the ‘bottom up’ approach may be followed in the matters of grievances (In departmental issues, from tutor to HoD and in general issues, from teacher in charge/ Grievance Committee to Principal and from Principal to Manager).
- 1.4 Campus is under CCTV surveillance
- 1.5 Access to college buildings after normal academic hours is permitted only with permission of Principal.

2. Academic Environment

- 2.1. The teaching staff, Non teaching staff and the students shall be alert and cooperative to ensure that the college has an excellent academic ambiance.
- 2.2 Every student, both as an individual and as part of a group shall ensure that his/her actions do not disturb the teaching and learning process in the college.

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- 2.3 Students shall keep self discipline to concentrate on their studies and not to disturb the academic activities of other students.
 - 2.4 All teachers are expected to be actively involved in maintaining academic atmosphere in the campus.
 - 2.5 Head of the Departments shall ensure that the tutor has made alternate arrangements for dealing with 'free hours'.
 - 2.6 The tutor shall be responsible for maintaining discipline among his/her students.
 - 2.7 All teachers shall engage their allotted classes regularly on time. They shall leave the class only when the bell rings.
 - 2.8 All the teachers shall record the attendance in a legible manner and shall hand over it to the office promptly.

3. Attendance of Students

- 3.1 In the first hour, concerned teacher shall go to the class before the third bell.
- 3.2 The first hour attendance shall be collected by the NTS during the earliest 10 minutes of the hour.
- 3.3 On genuine grounds, late students may personally meet the Principal and get the attendance if he permits. Students without uniform and tag will not get attendance.
- 3.4 If any free hour occurs during the day, attendance shall be given to the students as follows:
 - Any hour in the forenoon - Those who have attended the previous one/ two FN hours.
 - Any hour in the afternoon - Those who have attended the other AN hour.
 - Entire half day - Those who have attended all the engaged hours of the day.
- 3.5 Monthly attendance report shall be displayed in the department notice boards.

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- 3.6 All teachers shall take into account the general attendance of the student in all subjects during the semester while awarding internal marks.
 - 3.7 Students, who are continuously absent without any intimation for more than 10 working days will have their names removed from the rolls. They may be readmitted at the discretion of the Principal, in which case they will have to pay the re-admission fee of Rs. 50 and all college fees due before they are re-admitted.(DC Hand book rule 15.5).
 - 3.8 A student coming to the class late without prior permission shall lose half a day's attendance, unless otherwise recommended by the tutor. (DC Hand book rule15.5)
 - 3.9 Absence of one period will be counted as absence for half a day and absence for more than one period as absence for one day.
 - 3.10 The annual certificate of attendance requires for the admission to the University examination will not be granted unless the student has secured 75% of attendance during each semester.
 - 3.11 No student is permitted to cell any other student from the class without written permission of principal or teacher concerned.

4. Attendance Compensation

- 4.1 Attendance compensation shall be limited to the classes lost for official purposes only.
- 4.2 Application for leave should be made in the prescribed form to the Principal through the recommending authority (Tutor) by the student himself/herself, except in unavoidable and unforeseen circumstances when the application should be made on the very day of his/her, return to the college. The compensation form shall be submitted to the office within 7 days from the date of return of the student to the college.
- 4.3 Attendance compensation shall not be given to medical purposes.

5. Use of Vehicles in the campus by the students

- 5.1 All students who bring vehicle to the campus shall obtain a Vehicle Pass from the college Office which will be issued only after submitting a proper application which carries the parent's consent and an affidavit that they would obey all motor vehicle rules and regulations and road safety measures.
- 5.2 All students who wish to obtain the Vehicle Pass shall attach copies of Registration Certificate (R.C) and valid driving license along with the application.
- 5.3 Vehicles of students shall be parked only at places allotted for the purpose.
- 5.4 No parking is permitted on the sides of the road and in front of the building.
- 5.5 If any parking is noticed in the prohibited areas, a fine of Rs. 250 will be charged from the student who has obtained the Vehicle Pass.
- 5.6 The Vehicle Pass issued to the student shall be cancelled without any prior notice if he/she failed to comply with the above (5.1 - 5.5) directions.
- 5.7 Disciplinary action shall be taken against the custodian of the vehicle if a vehicle without pass is used inside the campus.

6. Dress Code

- 6.1 Students shall wear dresses that promote decency, modesty and the academic environment in the campus.
- 6.2 Students shall inculcate the habit of formal style of dressing in the campus.
- 6.3 For boys, only full length trousers or white coloured dhotis are permitted in the campus.
- 6.4 Low waist trousers, three by fourth trousers and leggings are not permitted in the campus.

6.5. Students should wear uniform on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. On Wednesdays formal dress code has to be maintained. T-Shirts and fancy wears are not permitted.

6.6 Uniform is exempted on special occasions, Onam, X'mas, Union inauguration, College day, Sports day, Arts day, Keralapiravi.

7. Use of Mobile phone in the campus

7.1 As per the order of the Government of Kerala, mobile phones shall be switched off before entering the campus.

7.2 In the event of any emergency, students shall make phone calls from the department with the permission of teachers or principal's office with the permission of Principal.

7.3 If any student is seen with the switched on mobile inside the campus disciplinary action shall be initiated against him/her and a fine of Rs. 350 will be charged from him/her.

Rules of Conduct

1. Students are supposed to be in the class before the second bell and stand up in silence for prayer at the stroke of the third bell.
2. Be regular in attending classes. When leave is required for unavoidable reasons the applications for the same in the prescribed form duly recommended by the tutor should be submitted to the office.
3. Smoking is strictly prohibited in the campus. The use of drugs, in any of its forms is a penal offence.
4. No students on any account shall make chalk or pencil mark or drawing in the board, walls and furniture. No member shall throw any waste material in the college premises.
5. Students are forbidden to collect money from other students without the permission of the Principal.
6. Ragging is a serious criminal offense which should not be occurred inside or outside the campus.
7. Students may follow the Election Rules and Regulations and updates there upon framed by Kannur University and the college timely.
8. Students are expected to wear ID Card while in the campus

Code of Conduct related to Meetings

1. The consent of the Principal is mandatory in all choices of guests of honour in connection with the programmes conducted by the College Union. Persons connected to political parties are not permitted to be guests of honour unless they are democratically elected in an official election or hold a statutory position.
2. Any function being conducted by the College Union should obtain a formal consent from the Principal four days in advance. To obtain the consent, a detailed programme schedule shall be submitted to the Principal.
3. Decorations if any shall be restricted only in the stage and the same shall be done with the formal consent of the staff advisor.

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4. Decorations must be with multicolour balloons only.
 5. Do not destroy, disfigure or damage the college property.
 6. Spend the free periods in library or reading room instead of loitering about.
 7. Standing in the verandah and sitting on the walls of verandah should be avoided.
 8. Do not enter other classes without the permission of the Principal.
 9. Do not participate in any organization or activity against the harmony and fellowship of the campus.
 10. Do not bring outsiders to the college without the permission of the principal.
 11. Without permission do not put any notice on the notice board or display any poster or flag within the college campus.
 12. Without permission do not display any poster or flag outside the college, with college or department name.

Computer Lab Guidelines

1. Students should maintain absolute silence and decorum in the lab.
2. Students should use computers taking care of them as their own property
3. Students should leave their footwear outside the lab in the space allotted.
4. The furniture in the computer lab should be kept intact.
5. No student is permitted to shift or interchange any part of the computer with another.
6. Log out and shutdown the computer, when you leave
7. Use the lab only for academic requirements.
8. For any hardware problem, report to the Lab-in –charge.
9. Personal programme files should not be installed in the computer for licensing and security reasons.

Internal Exam rules

1. Internal assessment is held twice a semester; one is the middle of the semester and the second, prior to the end semester University Exams.
2. Students should wear their identity card around their neck when they appear for the examinations
3. Candidates must appear at the examination room at least fifteen minutes before the commencement of the examination.
4. Candidates shall not communicate with one another in any manner whatsoever during the examination.
5. Candidates who use or view any unauthorized materials or electronic devices while their examination is in progress - or who assist or obtain assistance from other candidates or from any unauthorized source - are liable to penalties under the Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters, including the loss of academic credit and suspension.
6. In general, candidates will not be permitted to enter an examination room later than fifteen minutes after the commencement of the examination

Disciplinary Action

1. If any student is found involved in any kind of indiscipline, disciplinary action shall be initiated against him/her even without a formal complaint from anybody.
2. Students are not expected to challenge any kind of undisciplined acts their own as individual or member of a group. Rather, they shall bring such incidents into the attention of authorities.
3. Gang's or any kind of gang activities are not permitted in the campus.
4. Any student found to be in the campus after consuming liquor/ drugs or under intoxication shall be liable for disciplinary action.
5. Disciplinary actions shall include a reprimand (rebuke), issue of a memo, suspension and dismissal from the College.

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6. Two reprimands shall be treated as equivalent to a memo, two memos shall be treated as equivalent to a suspension and two suspensions shall be treated as equivalent to the dismissal.
 7. The student shall submit the signed application for T.C in order to revoke his/her first suspension.
 8. The acts of indiscipline shall be reflected in the conduct certificate being issued by the Principal.
 9. The Discipline Committee Chairman shall keep a record of all disciplinary actions of the academic year concerned.
 10. The Staff Council has the authority to relax, modify and/or cancel any of the above directions if the situation warrants such an action.

College Identity Card

1. Students should wear their identity card around their neck in the campus throughout the academic schedule. No student without identity card and uniform shall enter the campus.
2. Students should carry their identity cards when they represent the college in any function outside.
3. Loss of identity card must be intimated to the college office immediately.
4. Replacement of lost identity card will be done at a cost decided by the Principal.
5. Students should produce their identity card to enter library.
6. Students should surrender their identity card when they complete their course to get their Transfer Certificate issued.
7. Every student is bound to produce his/her ID card demanded by any teacher working in St. Pius X College, Rajapuram while he/she is in campus.
8. Students are expected to wear the identity tag while in the campus no attendance.

College Union

The College Union is formed every year under the guidance of staff adviser through elections, which are conducted in accordance with the rules stipulated by the University.

College Magazine

The magazine committee is formed every year under the guidance of staff adviser and staff editor. The editing and publishing of magazine require permission of staff editor, student editor and the editorial board. Principal is the chief editor of the magazine committee. The main aim behind the publishing of magazine is to develop the creativity of the students. The College Magazine will be published once in a year during the course of an academic year.

The Editor:- The Editor of the College Magazine shall be elected by the elected class representatives. No student of the final year class of a particular course will be eligible for election as the Editor of the College Magazine. There will be an Editorial Board and the Editorial Board shall consist of:

1. Principal
2. The Student Editor (Convener)
3. The Chairman of the College Union
4. The General Secretary of the College Union
5. Three student members who will be nominated by the Executive Committee
6. Staff Editor who will be a staff member nominated by the Principal

Procedure for selecting articles to the College Magazine

The student editor shall be responsible for collecting articles from students and teachers. He shall keep a list of articles received from students and teachers. The articles received shall be presented before the Editorial Board for a preliminary screening. After the preliminary screening, the Board can make its general impressions about the eligibility of articles. The articles should be original works of the students, and the pirated articles if ascertained involving any copy right violation shall not be entertained. The

articles should be typed on one side of the paper keeping space between the lines for making corrections. If an article is accepted by the Board to be included in the magazine, the same shall be handed over to the student editor for necessary editing. A copy of the articles collected shall be handed over to the Staff Editor for editing. The Staff Editor in consultation with the Chief Editor can suggest changes in the articles and seek the support of other staff members or experts for evaluating the articles and the Student Editor shall be duty bound to implement the changes suggested by the Staff Editor. Three spirally bound draft copies of the magazine with all the pages should be submitted to the Staff Editor and the staff editor shall forward two copies to the Chief Editor. The Staff Editor has to ensure that all the corrections suggested by him and the Chief Editor are incorporated in the draft. The Chief Editor shall evaluate the contents of the magazine either personally or with the assistance of experts he or she appoints. The Staff Editor and Chief Editor can propose necessary suggestions and the student editor has to implement those suggestions while making the final draft. Two copies of the final draft with all the suggested modifications are to be handed over to the Chief Editor and the Chief Editor shall give his approval for printing the magazine in writing to the student editor if he is satisfied with the final draft submitted by the student editor. The approved final draft of the magazine shall be presented in the editorial board. No modification shall be done to the approved copy during the process of printing. A copy of the consent letter/approval letter shall be kept by the student editor.

Regarding the insertion of photographs, pictures pertaining to the relevant previous year alone shall be included in the magazine. The photographs of College Union members shall be affixed in the hierarchical order given by the University and should have similar size. All other individual photographs of students should be smaller or at the maximum equal in size in comparison with the photographs of union members.

A general protocol should be followed in publishing messages from political leaders if any in the college magazine.

Copies of the Magazine will be distributed to all students (except first year) and members of the staff. Copies will also ordinarily be sent to all other Colleges in the State. The Staff Editor will be the sole responsible person for all cash transactions connected with the College Magazine.

New Generation Course - B.Sc. Life Sciences (Zoology) and Computational Biology

In 2020, Kerala Government granted 197 New Generation UG and PG Programmes all over the state. B.Sc. Life Sciences (Zoology) and Computational Biology Programme of Pius X College is one among the 7 New Generation Programmes granted to Aided Arts and Science Colleges in Kannur University. In Kerala, only St. Pius X College offers B.Sc. Life Sciences (Zoology) and Computational Biology Programme, adds attraction to this course. Currently this Programme is a Choice Based Credit and Semester System (KUCBCSS) and Outcome Based Education System (OBE) under Kannur University. It is a Language Reduced Programme (LRP) with English and Additional Language (Hindi/Malayalam) only during the first and second semester. The Programme offers Core Course- Life Sciences (Zoology) and Computational Biology, Complementary Elective Courses – Microbiology and Computer Science and Generic Elective Course- First Aid. FACILITIES

1. Library and Information Centre

The College has a well established library which caters to the need of the undergraduate and post graduate students, research scholars and the faculty. The college library has a collection of about 16,605 books and 81 journals and Magazines in various disciplines of science and humanities. Services such as lending of books and journals, reading room, reprographic facilities and bibliographic reference and information are rendered by the library. The students and staff also can have access to National Library and Information Service Infrastructure of Scholarly content (N-LIST) through INFLIBNET. The Library offers Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) - a computerized catalogue service. Most of the books in the library are bar coded. This helps the circulation counter in issue and return of books quickly. Members are given bar - coded ID cards and books are issued on producing the ID cards.

Rules and Regulations

1. All users are to use their Library Identity card for access to the controlgate to enter the library.
2. All students are required to keep their library Identity card and produce it if asked for identification.
3. 3. Students are not allowed to take other books, files, printed materials or any other articles inside the library. However, they can keep such articles at the property counter provided in front of the lending section of the library.

4. 4. Borrowing and returning of books must be done through the circulation counter between 9 am and 5 pm. This facility is not available on Sundays and holidays.
 5. Fine will be charged for the books returned after the due date as follows. Re1 per day per book till 14 days after the due date.
 6. Book or any other literature taken for reference, against library membership card, must be read within the library and must be returned before leaving the library. Defaulters will have to pay a fine.
 7. Students are requested to return the book at the circulation counter taken for reading from the main book stack.
 8. Mutilation and disfiguring of pages of books are strictly prohibited. A person shall be held responsible for any damage done to the documents of the library. He has to replace such documents by latest edition or to pay double the latest cost. If a section is damaged from the document the whole set shall be liable to be replaced.
 9. Library book / book bank if lost, the concerned student has to replace book by latest edition or to pay double the latest cost.
 10. All books shall be returned to the Library three days before the closing of each term.
 11. The librarian has the right to recall any book at 24 hours notice.
 12. Students shall maintain pin drop silence inside the library.
 13. Cellular phones are not allowed inside the library.
 14. The users must make a conscious effort to keep the library clean. Edibles are not allowed inside the library.
 15. The books, notes etc. used to reserve seats may be removed by any other user and the library is not responsible for loss of such personal books/notes.
 16. Chairs and tables and other library equipment, fittings and furniture should not be marked, defaced or disarranged.

2. Book Bank

A book club was formed in our college with the intention of helping poor students. Poor students can borrow books from the book bank for a period of one year. The main objective of the book bank is to promote reading habits and keep the students and staff aware of latest publications.

3. Language Lab

The college houses an efficiently running Language Lab which is equipped with well functioning computer systems at the disposal of the students and staff. The lab can be utilised for academic as well as non-academic purposes. Located near to the college library, it is being instrumented by the Language department for various academic activities. With quality copiers, scanners and a personnel to head it all, it also functions as a really beneficial reprographic centre for the college.

4. Reprographic Facility

At moderate rate the college offers photostat facility to students and staffs at the co-operative store, library & college office.

5. The Counselling Centre

The definition of counselling is “empowerment of a person to face the realities of life.” The three principles of counseling are (i) The teachers are the agents of rescripting. (ii) The touch of significance generates significance. (iii) Energy follows thoughts. The counseling center of St. Pius X College takes care of the students who really need special attention. We identify the depressed minds and pacify them. Rev. Sr. Tony SVM is our student councillor.

6. The Seminar Hall

The college also boasts of bearing a seminar conference hall for holding programs of a more elite nature. It has a seating capacity for more than 100 individuals and is endowed with an effective projector screen and a well functioning audio system suited for the convenience of the attendees.

7. The Auditorim

The college is decorated with a vast auditorium which is used for hosting various extracurricular programs and functions. It is an expansive hall which accomodates more than 300 persons at a time, greeted by a beautifully structured dais and supported by a well operative high-fidelity system.

8. Indoor Stadium

The fifteen years old institution has gained a new identity with an mposing state of the Indoor stadium, constructed with a grant of Rs.70 Lakhs from UGC and Rs.70 Lakhs from the Management. The ambience is pleasant and professional with the polished wooden floor measuring around 5000 Sq.ft. The stadium has a seating capacity of 1000 spectators and it has four Badminton Courts, one Volleyball Court, one Basketball court and has provision for two Table Tennis Courts. in addition to these facilities, a multi-gym and two guest rooms are also provided. The speciality of the stadium is that each and every part of the exterior decoration is reusable and has the subjected to green audit screening.

9. Multi-Gym

The college indoor stadium houses a multi gymnasium that is very well equipped with all the modern requirements for healthy and systematic physical fitness trainings.

A Brief Description of Various Committees and Clubs

1. Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

Internal quality assurance cell is the post accreditation quality sustenance measure devised according to the guidance of NAAC. The basic purposes of the IQAC are;

1. To ensure continuous improvement in the entire operations of the institution, and
2. To assure stake holders connected with the higher education namely, students, parents, teachers, staff, would be employers, funding agencies and society in general-of accountability of the institution for its own quality and probity. The IQAC will function under the institution for its own quality and probity. The IQAC will function under the guidance of the Quality Advisory Committee with Mr. Biju Joseph as Co-ordinator.

2. RUSA

Rashtriya Uchchattar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) is a holistic scheme of development for higher education in India initiated in 2013 by the Ministry of Education, Government of India. The centrally sponsored scheme aims at providing strategic funding to higher educational institutions throughout the country. Funding is provided by the central ministry through the state governments and union territories (UT), which in coordination with the central Project Appraisal Board will monitor the academic, administrative and financial advancements taken under the scheme. Our college has qualified under the RUSA scheme and development works worth Rs.2 crores have been implemented in the college.

3. NIRF

The National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) was

approved by the MHRD and launched on 29th September 2015. This framework outlines a methodology to rank institutions across the country. The methodology draws from the overall recommendations and broad understanding arrived at by a core committee set up by MHRD, to identify the broad parameters for ranking various universities and institutions. Presently the five parameters fixed to evaluate the participating institutes are, Teaching, Learning & Resources (TLR); Research and Professional Practice (RP); Graduation Outcomes (GO); Outreach and Inclusivity (OI); and Peer Perception. Our college participates regularly on this ranking process and we were able to achieve a Rank-band 101-150 for the colleges in India for the year 2018.

4. Planning Forum

It enables members to study the different aspects of the 5 year plan, to spread the message of planning among the people and to help in the implementation of plan projects. This forum helps to create awareness on planning and planned economic development of the country through discussion, meeting debates and seminars.

5. Academic Council

The Academic Council is principal academic body of the Institute and shall subject to the provisions to the Memorandum of Association and the Rules and Bye-Laws shall have the control over and be responsible for the maintenance of standards of education, teaching and training, inter departmental co-ordination, research, examinations and tests with in the Institute and shall exercise such other powers and perform such other duties and functions as may be imposed or conferred upon it by the Rules and Bye-Laws.

6. Grievance and Redressal Cell

The strength of a system consists in its ability to identify and rectify the shortcomings. The following procedure is observed by the Grievance - Redressal cell. the students can put forward their grievances through the channel - tutor-hod-Principal.

In addition, two boxes are kept in the college by this cell. Students can put their complaints in any of these boxes. Every

month grievance redressal cell collects these complaints and do the needful to redress grievance.

A committee may go through it and suggest solutions, ratified by the council and principal. The decision is made known to all.

The students are asked to forego the present form of politics including any disturbance to the smooth conduct of regular classes, boycotts, strikes and other sorts of human rights violation inside the campus.

7. SC/ST/OBC Cell

Introduction : SC/ST/OBC cell has been constituted in the college campus to resolve all the affairs and problems related to the SC/ST/OBC students and faculties.

Objectives : To bring the students belongs to SC/ST/OBC community at par with the main stream student body. To create a platform where students can raise their academic and non academic issues. To monitor the implementation of reservation policy in the institution.

Responsibilities : Committee often meets the students belonging to SC/ST/OBC communities, to understand their problem and take necessary action and/or render them necessary advice/help to resolve the matter. Creating awareness among the SC/ST/OBC students regarding the various Government and Non- Government scholarship schemes. Providing counseling to the students to help them overcome their mental barriers.

8. Anti Ragging Cell

The Anti-ragging Committee is nominated and headed by the Head of the Institution, and consists of representatives of civil and police administration, Local administrative bodies, reputed personalities, representatives of faculty members, representatives of students, and non- teaching staff; and shall have a diverse mix of membership in terms of level as well as gender. It shall be the duty of the Anti-Ragging Committee to ensure compliance with the

provisions of Ragging Prohibition Act as well as the provisions of any law for the time being in force concerning ragging; and also to monitor and oversee the performance of the Anti-Ragging Squad in prevention of ragging in the institution.

9. National Service Scheme (NSS)

Bread for our self is material. Bread for others is spiritual. The main aim of the NSS is to educate the student community the need of social commitment through community service. They get ample opportunities to come in touch with the community around to channelise their energy through constructive social action and to become aware of social problems and needs.

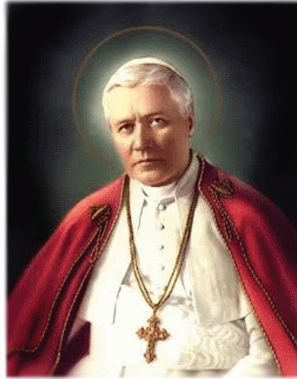
